## **Ages for Development of Speech Sounds**

These are ages at which approximately 90% of children correctly produce each sound.

Most of these sounds are written in the phonetic alphabet, and the sounds in parentheses are the way we would usually spell them in English.

A dash before the sound (-f) means the sound is at the end of a word.

A dash after the sound (I-) means the sound is at the beginning of a word or syllable.
